Once you have completed your online registration, you MUST bring the requested information and your postdated cheques to 1 of the 3 in-person registration sessions. All 3 of the sessions will be held at Blue Quill Community League Hall located at 11304 – 25 Ave NW on the following dates:

Wednesday, August 29th from 6pm to 9pm Tuesday, September 4th from 6pm to 9pm Thursday, September 6th from 6pm to 9pm

Please Note: If your child is registered for the Premier Program only (tryout required), do NOT attend a community payment session. Once the SW Sting FC teams are finalized, they will hold their own payment session.

The indoor community soccer program relies on parent volunteers to make the program a success and we encourage all our community members to consider volunteering to coach or assistant coach as these positions are the hardest to recruit and are the most important to ensure that all the teams can be formed and include all the children that register.

New this year is U5 (born 2014) program which will be limited to 80 registrants. All games will be played at the Sports TC Complex located at 9203 – 35 Ave NW on Sunday mornings.

If you missed the on-time registration and/or payment deadline, complete the registration & provide the SWEMSA office with all the fees, deposits & supporting documents. Once received, your child's name will be added to the wait-list & placed after all on-time paid players in the zone are on teams. Confirmation would be sent to you after the SW Sting FC tryout results are known.

Sportball

The Greater Windermere Community League (GWCL) is pleased to be offering a 4 week Sportball Program to its members. The program will run on Monday nights from September 24th to October 22nd (no classes on Thanksgiving Monday – October 8th). There will be two offerings of the program, one at 6pm and one at 7pm. And will be offered at Constable Daniel Woodall School here in Windermere.

The class at 6:00pm-6:45pm will be geared towards children under the age of 5 who are not attending Kindergarten but are mobile (can walk and run with ease). The second class at 7:00pm-7:45pm will be geared towards younger school aged children. This program requires parental supervision and you are NOT allowed to leave your child(ren) unattended.

GWCL has contracted instructors from Sport Ball to host these classes and we are able to offer them at a discount to our members. These classes normally cost \$68 from Sportball but we will be offering the classes for \$45 per child for the 4 weeks to our members. Please bring a cheque (made out to the Greater Windermere Community League) or cash to the first class on September 24th. Your child will not be allowed to participate until payment has been received.

At this time, we can only offer this program to Greater Windermere Community League Members and their children under 12 years of age (elementary school aged). However, the structure of the programming is geared towards younger children under the age of 8.

The goal of reuse is to keep using items as long as they have a function or value. The eco-station in Ambleside located at 14710 Ellerslie Rd SW has a re-use area where you can drop off or pick up a variety of upcycle items such as used bikes, leftover household paints, TVs, stereos, and computer peripherals (computers are not available due to privacy issues).

Are you a gardener? The Ambleside Eco-station offers free mulch.
